"Koło cyrku" Krzysztof Michno

Krzysztof Michno was born in 1956 in Kraków. He is a graduate of the Secondary School of Fine Arts. Antoni Kenar in Zakopane. Cartoonist, graphic artist, reporter, screenwriter, traveler. He cooperated with TVP in the production of documentaries and is the author of numerous television scripts, including: "Where I go, you will go one day" - a film with the participation of Fr. prof. J. Tischner.

Krzysztof Michno writes about himself: "Drawing is probably the most personal and closest form to me, and perhaps due to the unnecessary expansion of the studio, it allows me to write down what I need at any place and time. (...). I am looking for answers to many questions. I try to complete the tasks I set for myself, whether in the field of drawing or other disciplines. I think I still have a long way to go and I'm trying to get through it as effectively as possible... I'm constantly learning how to walk in the world.

"Świt" Marek Szczepanik

Born July 7, 1964 in Nieszkowice Wielkie, province Lesser Poland. From an early age, the artist grew up in the countryside, which shaped his artistic sensitivity. The artist's works often deal with topics related to the natural world. Monumental mountain peaks, rustling grass, lonely trees, landscapes full of meadows and fields. The artist's painting brings to mind dreamlike spaces. The colorful compositions on the canvas seem frozen in time, the summer sun or immersed in fog. Dreamy landscapes attract the viewer's eyes with their delicacy, providing relief that embraces the viewer. Looking with awakening nostalgia, for what is fleeting and passing like the seasons. Or the time of carefree moments associated with holidays. The painter presents what is visible on the canvases in a way that is consistent with the natural, eternal cycle of nature, not yet trampled by people and not screaming ugliness.

The artist travels a lot every day, his openness and honesty towards people is reflected in the real world that emanates from his canvases. Marek Szczepanik's work brings a lot of joy that comes from the ability to experience an ordinary day and appreciate everything that is beautiful in harmony with nature and harmony. He himself says about his painting: "I paint what I encounter, what surrounds me. There is a lot of beauty around us, you just have to look a little closer or a little further sometimes." Marek Szczepanik paints his paintings with delicate brush strokes, and sometimes he uses thick relief lines with a brush or palette knife, thus obtaining an interesting structure on the surface of the canvas. He creates in oil, acrylic and pastel techniques.

Born in Strzyżów in 1923. Studied at the Faculty of Painting of the Academy of Fine Arts in Krakow in the studios of professors Zygmunt Radnicki, Zbigniew Pronaszko and Jerzy Fedkowicz. She received her diploma in 1953. She organized 35 individual exhibitions of painting and drawing, took part in over 150 national and community exhibitions and in 50 exhibitions of Polish art abroad, including: International Youth Exhibition - Berlin (1956), Festival of Youth and Students - Vienna (1959), International Exhibition them. Joan Miro - Barcelona and Gijon (1970), 4th International Drawing Exhibition - Yugoslavia (1974), Christchurch Arts - International Festival of Drawing Christchurch - New Zealand (1978).

As a representative of ZPAP, she participated in cultural exchanges in Norway, the former USSR and Yugoslavia several times.

Scholarship holder of the French Government in 1963 and the Ministry of Culture and Art in 1967/77. Winner of many awards and distinctions. She was awarded the ZPAP Golden Badge (1976), the Meritorious Cultural Activist Badge (1981), and the Golden Cross of Merit (1982).

She was active in easel painting, wall painting, graphics and drawing, and tapestry design. She was also involved in teaching - she was an assistant professor at the Department of Drawing and Sculpture at the Faculty of Architecture of the Krakow University of Technology (1961-1982).


Her works are in the collections of the National Museum in Warsaw, Kraków, the Museum in Bielsko-Biała, Bytom, Rzeszów, Tarnów, Szczecin, Olsztyn, the Wawel Art Collections and many other state and private collections.

She died in 1994 in Krakow and rests in the cemetery in Krakow.

Jerzy Dmitruk (born 1960 in Sępopol) – painter, graphic artist, illustrator, associated with the Krakow artistic community.

He studied at the Faculty of Painting of the Academy of Fine Arts in Krakow with prof. Juliusz Joniak. He defended his diploma in 1986. He completed his education at the Faculty of Graphics at his alma mater, in the intaglio printing studio of prof. Andrzej Pietsch and in the book and typography studio of doc. Roman Bonaszewski. The artist creates graphic series, including "The Sower of Harvest", "The Painter's Life", "Mission", "Trees of Revelations", "House", "Garden of First Love". He paints most often on large formats. His paintings are characterized by a wealth of colors and textures. The dominant themes are landscapes depicting fantastic, deformed landscapes and still lifes. The artist simplifies the elements of the composition into simple geometric figures. Jerzy Dmitruk also creates graphic designs for books (including "Goodbye, see you tomorrow" by Wisława Szymborska, "When I meet you, what will I tell you" by Mirosław Czyżykiewicz, "Explain to me, love" by Ingeborg Bachmann and others) and bookplates.

Jerzy Dmitruk's works are in the collections of the National Museum in Krakow, the Silesian Museum in Katowice, the Museum of the Sądecka Region and the Department of Culture and Art of the Krakow City Hall.

Małgorzata Jenta-Dmitruk studied at the Academy of Fine Arts in Krakow, received her diploma at the Faculty of Graphics in 1986 in the intaglio printing studio of prof. A. Pietsch.

Scholarship holder of the Minister of Culture and Art. Her paintings are a record of passing time and impressions to which there is no return, presented using signs and symbols reminiscent of Egyptian pictorial writing. Messages are written according to a unique code using regular panel divisions of the canvas. However, there is no restlessness or activity. The subtlety of white, ocher and green colors determines decorative and magical values leading towards spiritual areas of concentration and meditation.

He graduated from the Academy of Fine Arts in Krakow, Faculty of Interior Design. He creates figurative works with strong simplifications and deformations of form. The paintings are characterized by aggressive colors and strong contours. The artist's neo-expressionist style is close to the tendencies of Neue Wilde (New Expression) created in the late 1970s in Germany. The artist was awarded the Silver Cross of Merit by the Minister of Culture and the Distinction of the City of Krakow as a distinguished activist of culture and art.

He studied at the Krakow Academy of Fine Arts in the studio of Tadeusz Łakomski, receiving his diploma in 1957. He participated in many exhibitions in Poland and abroad, Eugeniusz Tukan-Wolski had his first individual exhibition in 1965 in Krakow. In the same year, he exhibited his works at the Kościuszko Foundation, and also in 1984 in Cologne, in 1985 in Kiel, and in 1987 and 1988 in New York. During his painting career, the artist had fifteen solo exhibitions, four of which took place in the United States. The artist's paintings are in the collections of the Documentation Center. John Paul II in Rome, in the National Museum in Krakow and in private collections.

He studied painting at Jerzy Tchórzewski's Studio. He obtained his diploma at Maciej Urbaniec's Poster Studio in 1991. His painting works were purchased and used in their publications by the Chancellery of the President of the Republic of Poland, the Chancellery of the Prime Minister of the Republic of Poland, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Poland, and the Polish Representation to the EU in Brussels.

He is a member of the Association of Polish Watercolor Painters. In addition to painting, he is interested in, among others: ballooning, which he revealed in a number of works devoted to this subject.



Rafał Olbiński

Rafał Olbiński, born Józef Rafał Olbiński (born February 21, 1943 in Kielce[3]) - Polish painter, graphic artist and poster creator, and one of the representatives of the Polish poster school. His works are exhibited in numerous galleries and museums (the Library of Congress, the Museum of Modern Art in Toyama, the Carnegie Foundation in New York and the Poster Museum in Wilanów), as well as collected by private collectors around the world. Rafał Olbiński started cooperation with such magazines as "The New York Times", "Newsweek", "Bloomberg Businessweek" and "Der Spiegel". In Poland he dealt with, among others, designing album covers, e.g. by Krzysztof Klenczon, Tell me, man, where have you been (Pronit SX 1614) and Breakout Żagiel Ziemi (Pronit SX 1821). From 1997 to 2003, he regularly created covers for the Polish monthly psychological magazine "Charaktery" and was a co-creator of the magazine's graphic image.

His work has been widely awarded at many international competitions. In 1995, he received the first prize in the "New York City Capital of the World" competition - for a poster promoting New York as the capital of the world. In 1994 he was awarded the so-called International Oscar for the most unforgettable poster in the world in the "Prix Savignac" competition in Paris, and in 1976 first prize in the competition of the Institute of Human Rights in Strasbourg. By the mid-1990s, he had accumulated approximately 100 awards.



The Division 1A Ice Hockey World Championships with the participation of the Polish national team were held on April 19-25, 2015 at the TAURON Arena Kraków. Poles competed with Japan, Kazakhstan, Ukraine, Hungary and Italy.

The Poland-Hungary match, which decided about the promotion of one of these teams to the World Cup elite, was watched by nearly 13,000 viewers at the TAURON Arena Kraków. The white and red team lost 1-2 (0-0, 0-0, 1-2) and took third place. The two bonus positions were won by the teams of Kazakhstan and Hungary, and the Ukrainian team was relegated to Division 1 B.



Maria Husarska - In the years 1996-2001 she attended the Secondary School of Fine Arts in Krakow and received a diploma in exhibition art. Since 2001 - studies at the Faculty of Painting at the Academy of Fine Arts in Krakow in the studio of prof. Adam Brincken, Diploma in 2006 in the interdisciplinary studio of prof. Zbigniew Bajek titled "Inner - Outer Horizon" and an annex with the photography "Identity" in Agata Pankiewicz's studio.

The series of diploma paintings was presented during an exhibition at the Palace of Art and honored by the Society of Friends of Jan Matejko, and was presented during a collective exhibition at the Jan Matejko House. The artist's diploma paintings "Horizon" were purchased and are in a private collection at the Sultan Business Center in Dubai. Her works were presented at individual exhibitions at the Stu Theater in Krakow, Faust Gallery in Krakow, Schody Gallery in Warsaw, Arsene Wiatrak Gallery, Academy of Fine Arts Gallery in Krakow, and were also exhibited in numerous galleries in Rome and Milan.

The artist deals with painting, photography, film and ceramics.

Maria Husarska's painting is shaped in the context of the specificity of the Krakow artistic environment. The avant-garde is always moderated by tradition, and the reliability of the workshop and "building with color" is mandatory.

All these advantages can be seen in the created still lifes, landscapes, and abstract studies, usually with very literary titles. The multitude of possibilities is striking: colorful, classic subject compositions, virtuoso portrait studies, but most often abstractions dominate - cold and hot, geometric and non-geometric. There are also linear, even calligraphic forms of faces and birds.

The latest series of paintings is presented at the Arsene Wiatrak Gallery in Krakow. The exhibition titled "HopeFull" presents a series of paintings and ceramics whose main motif and inspiration was the form and color of flamingos. The paintings can be seen until May 23 during the exhibition.
